	Wool Market Movements					
•	The Australian wool market rebounded this week with prices for Merino fleece wool lifting sharply. A fall in the A\$ against the US\$ and a smaller than expected offering helped boost prices. The week started on a strong note at the Launceston sale on Tuesday. On Wednesday, prices in Sydney and Fremantle lifted in line with Tuesday's close, before further gains in all three selling centres on Thursday. Both the EMI and WMI regained all of last week's losses and more. The EMI closed at 1284 Ac/kg, up 19 cents., while the WMI lifted by 28c to close at 1356 c/kg. The A\$ eased against the US\$ to 71.08 USc, down by 0.78c. The increase in the EMI in US\$ was therefore more modest than in A\$, up by 4USc to 913 USc/kg. A total of 37,844 bales were offered with 6.8% passed-in.					

- The first day of sales this week was a designated Launceston sale in Melbourne on Tuesday, which saw strong demand for the good selection of sylish 16 micron to 19 micron wool on offer. Prices for this wool lifted by 11c to 18c. There was limited offerings of other microns. Locks and crutchings eased by 10c-20c. Wednesday's sale in Melbourne saw a wider selection of broader Merino wool, which attracted good interest and prices lifted. Crossbred wool and Oddments were a little cheaper. The Melbourne sale finished on a strong note on Thursday, with solid gains for Merino wool across all microns. Crossbred wool also lifted, but locks and crutchings eased a little more.
- The first day of the sale in Sydney on Wednesday attracted 1400 strong buying interest. Fine Merino fleece prices lifted by 1350 between 16c and 32c, while broader Merino wool increased 1300 by 6c-12c. Finer Crossbred wools did well, but broader 1250 Crossbred prices slid. Oddments fell by 14c. On Thursday buyers turned their interest to the broader Merino wools, with gains of 20c-25c while prices for finer Merino wool were firm. Prices for Crossbred wool and Oddments were steady.
- Competition from buyers pushed the prices for all Merino fleece wools higher on Wednesday, with the most gains seen for wool broader than 19.5 micron. Good style wools with higher N/kt gained in excess of 30c. Demand for locks and crutchings waned and prices fell by up to 30c. The strong demand for fleece wools continued on Thursday, with gains of between 10c-25c. Prices for locks fell further, down by a much as 15c, while crutchings were unchanged.
