<ul> <li>After a relatively slow start in Sydney, the Australian wool market gathered pace on Wednesday and prices rose. A lift in the A\$ overnight on Wednesday held the market back on Thursday and prices steadied. After three weeks of declines, the EMI rose by 4cents to 1227 Ac/kg and the WMI finished the week at 1281c/kg, up 5 cents. The A\$ was up by 1.14 UScents for the week, with most of this gain occuring on Wednesday night. The A\$ closed at 75.97 UScents. The EMI in US\$ was up solidly for the week, closing at 932 USc/kg, a gain of 17 UScents. 38,842 bales were offered for the week, with a pass-in rate of 5.8%.</li> </ul>		Wool Market Movements

- The Sydney sale on Wednesday was generally softer than last week's close. Merino fleece prices generally drifted lower, although there were patches of better demand, notably for 19.5 micron wool (which lifted) and 22 micron (which was flat). A limited offering of Crossbred wool saw prices ease. Locks and crutchings were firm. On Thursday, prices in Sydney cauight up with the gains seen in Melbourne and Fremantle on Thursday on the back of a small offering. Merino fleece prices lifted by 5-10 cents. Crossbred wool prices were unchanged on a small offering. Oddments were firm.
- Melbourne recorded solid demand for Merino fleece wool which was a welcome relief after the falls in the past two weeks. Prices were higher by 5-10 cents across the micron range. Crossbred wool prices also gained ground and prices rose by around 10 cents. Locks firmed by 5-10 cents while crutchings were steady. Merino wool prices were firm to slightly higher on Thursday, with an easing trend towards the end of the day. Crossbred wool prices were flat to 10 cents cheaper. Locks and crutchings fell by 5 cents.
- Demand lifted in Fremantle on Wednesday and prices gained ground in all micron categories. Buying interest was strongest for better styled high tensile strength finer types, which lifted by 15 cents. All other fleece wools gained 10 cents. Locks and crutchings lifted by 10-15 cents for the day. Prices eased back on Thursday, mainly in fine/medium Merino fleece wool, as the higher \$A overnight on Wednesday dampened buying. Oddments were up unchanged.


