	Wool Market Movements
•	The choppy market conditions seen recently in the Australian wool market continued this week, with prices lifting in response to a fall in the A\$. The A\$ fell sharply on Wednesday and by the end of the week was at 76.21 UScents, down by almost 2 UScents on last week's high. The EMI rose by 34 cents to 1241 Ac/kg. The WMI rose by more, up 47 cents, and closed at 1325 Ac/kg,. In US\$ the EMI was 4 cents lower at 950 USc/kg as a result. There were only 34,397 bales offered, with 5.6% passed-in.
•	The two day sale in Sydney started strongly on Wedneday

- with Merino fleece wools gaining between 20-30 cents, with the fine end seeing the best increases. Prices for Crossbred were largely unchanged on last week's levels. Locks lifted by 10 cents, Crutchings fell by 10 cents and stains were down by 20 cents. Merino wool prices continued to lift on Thursday, rising by 15-20 cents, supported by a small offering. Crossbred prices were steady to slightly higher on a thin offering. Locks rose by 5 cents and Crutchings were firm.
- The lower A\$ and a small offering provided a boost for Merino wool prices on Wednesday in Melbourne. Wool between 17.5 and 19 micron attracted the most buyer interest, gaining 30 cents, while other microns lifted by 20-25 cents. Most Crossbred prices were flat, although 27-28 micron wool gained 10-5-10 cents. Locks were slightly 1400 higher while Crutchings were unchanged. There was a larger offering of Merino fleece wool on Thursday and this was more than matched strong buyer demand, resulting in prices rising across the board. Fine wools rose by 15-20 cents and broad wools lifted by 5-10 cents. Crossbred prices were firm. Oddments were unchanged.
- Of the three selling centres, Fremantle recorded the strongest gains in prices for the week. On Wednesday, finer Merino fleece prices in general rose by 25-35 cents, and 18.5 micron wool lifted by 40 cents. Broader Merino wool rose by 15-25 cents. Locks and Crutchings were 10 cents higher. Buyer interest was maintained on Thursday and prices for fine and medium Meri 25 cents. Limited supplies of b prices gain by 40 cents. Oddmen


