

Wool Market Movements
• An unexpected jump in the A\$ early in the week sent wool prices tumbling in spite of a small offering. Pass-in rates lifted as a result. The A\$ lifted by over 2 UScents to 74.7 UScents, the highest level in 5 weeks. In response, prices fell across the board in both Sydney and Melbourne, with the most significant falls for wool between 18 and 19.5 micron. There were no sales in Fremantle. The EMI fell by 26 Acents to 1270 Ac/kg, but the strong rise in the A\$ meant that in US\$ terms the EMI rose by 9 cents to 948 USc/kg. There were 27,231 bales offered for the week and the pass-in rate increased to 13%.

- Sydney's two-day sale opened on Wednesday to the news that the A\$ had lifted by more than 2 UScents overnight. Prices dropped sharply across all microns, with the largest absolute falls of up to 45 cents being recorded for Merino wool 19.5 microns and finer. The smaller offering of 20 micron and broader Merino wool saw prices slide by less, down 20 cents. Crossbred wool prices fell by 20 to 25 cents. Locks, Crutchings and Stains all fell by 20 cents. Thursday's sale saw prices steady for fine Merino wool and for Crossbred wool as the market found a new, lower level. Broader Merino wool fell back by up to 10 cents. Locks and Stains eased further while Crutchings were firm.
- Melbourne hosted a two-day sale this week. As in Sydney, the higher A\$ sapped buyer confidence on Wednesday. Merino prices were 20 to 30 cents cheaper, with the larger falls seen for finer types. Broader Merino wools were in lower supply and prices declined by 10 cents. Crossbred wool prices also fell back by 10 cents. Prices for Locks and Crutchings fell by 10 to 15 cents. The price falls continued on Thursday, notably for wool in the 18 to 19 micron range which fell by 20 cents. The lower spec types were most affected. Well specc'ed finer types did best. The limited offering of Crossbred wool saw prices fall by 15-20 cents. Prices for Locks and Crutchings slid by 5 to 10 cents.
