Wool Weekly

Wool Market Movements



•	Wool prices rose again in the Australian wool market,
	and the Eastern Market Indicator hit the highest level in
	over 5 years. It was a remarkably good week for
	superfine wool, with prices up by as much as 60 cents.
	Prices for medium Merino and broader Crossbred wool
	rose while broad Merino and fine Crossbred wool prices
	were flat to lower. The EMI finished 15 cents higher at
	1378 c/kg, lifting on Tuesday and Wednesday before
	pausing on Thursday. The A\$ was at 74.1 UScents, up by
	0.4 cents for the week, and the EMI lifted by 17 UScents
	to 1021 USc/kg. Almost 50,000 bales were offered for
	the week, of which 6.2% was passed-in.

- The two day sale in Sydney recorded another good lift in prices, with buyer interest firmly focused on superfine Merino wool, particularly Best/Spinner style types, with 40-60 cent gains. Medium Merino wool was dearer despite some weakness on Thursday. Crossbred wools generally gained ground. Solid demand for Locks and Crutchings on both days pushed prices up by 20 cents.
- Another three day sale in Melbourne saw strong buyer interest in finer Merino on the first two days with some easing on Thursday, although the Best/Spinners style wool remained in favour. Fine wools lifted by up to 60 cents. The gains were smaller for medium Merino wool and prices for broader types eased. Another mixed week for Crossbred wool saw broad wools up 10 cents but finer types lower again. Prices were firm for the small offering of Locks and Crutchings.
- The Fremantle sale opened on Wednesday to strong buyer competition for fine Merino wools, but less interest in broader wools. After a firm opening on Thursday, buyer interest waned and prices eased. Despite this, 18 micron wools lifted by 50 cents for the week, while 19 micron wool prices gained 20 cents. Broader Merino wool prices slid. Prices for Oddments lifted on Wednesday and then lost most of the gains o Thursday.

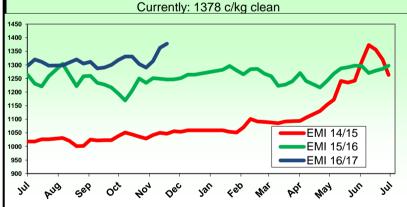
