| • | Prices in the Australian wool market surged this week, with the EMI finishing at 1500 c/kg, up 51 cents, with very strong price gains on both selling days. All microns and most wool types benefited from the jump, except for Crossbred cardings. The AUD eased slightly against the USD to 76.6 UScents and the EMI jumped by 34USc to 1148 UScents/kg. With prices spiking, only 2.9% of the 40,626 bales offered were passed-in. |

- Intense buyer interest drove prices higher on both sale days in Melbourne this week. Wednesday's sale saw Merino prices lift by 40-60 cents, with 18-19 micron wools rising most. Crossbred prices also lifted, by a more modest 5-10 cents. There was a further 20-40 cent gain on Thursday for Merino wool and Crossbreds were 10-20 cents dearer. Oddments were 20-40 cents higher.
- The two-day sale in Sydney saw Merino prices rise by 60-90 cents for the week, with the largest gains seen for 17-18 micron wool. Lower spec wools were in as much demand as the better spec wools. Crossbred wools lifted by 30-40 cents as they continue to bounce back from recent lows. Oddments rose by 10-20 cents on Wednesday and then held firm on Thursday.
- Fremantle saw the greatest price gains of the three selling centres on Wednesday, with prices jumping by 45-75 cents. The largest price increases were for wools broader than 20 microns. The market was steadier on Thursday, but strong nevertheless. A limited selection of Oddments saw prices lift by 20-30 cents.


