## Wool Weekly

**Wool Market Movements** 



•	The durability of the Australian wool market was tested
	this week by a stronger AUD. As a result, price trends
	between selling centres were very uneven, with prices
	falling in Melbourne, up and down in Sydney but mostly
	higher in Fremantle. Overall, the EMI declined by 12
	cents to 1522 c/kg mainly due to the lower prices in
	Melbourne. With the AUD higher by more than 1
	UScent, the EMI actually lifted by 8 UScents to 1135
	USc/kg. There were 35,020 bales offered over the week
	with a pass-in rate of 8.3%.

- A good selection of Spinners style fine Merino wool encouraged buyers at the two-day sale in Sydney this week. Prices steadied after the volatility of recent weeks, with some small gains and losses. While lots with higher VM were penalised, low VM wools attracted good competition on both sale days. The small offering of Crossbred wool saw prices for fine Crossbreds gain ground, but broader wools fell back over the week. Fine Locks on offer were in demand and prices lifted. Stains and Crutchings were steady.
- The two-day sale in Melbourne was marked by a significant drop in buyer interest in the Merino offering. Prices for Merino wool fell sharply across the micron range as a result, with losses of up to 40 cents for superfine Merino wool. Broader Merino wool did a little better, with more moderate declines. Demand for fine Crossbred wool was solid and prices lifted by 5-10 cents. After a steady first day on Wednesday, demand for Crutchings and Stains dipped on Thursday and prices fell by up to 20 cents. Locks were steady.
- Fremantle hosted a two-day sale and prices for 20 micron and broader wool rebounded after last week's losses. Buyers were keen in spite of a large offering of this wool and prices rose on both days, lifting by 10-15 cents over the week. In contrast, prices for fine Merino wool mostly fell on Wednesday before steadying on Thursday. Prices for the very small offering of Oddments were unchanged on the previous week.

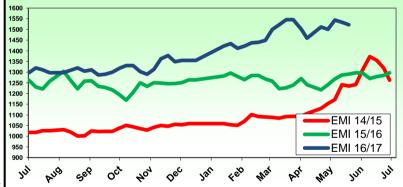
