**Wool Market Movements** 

Friday




•	The Australian wool market lifted strongly this week,
	continuing the recovery begun last Thursday. While all
	Merino wools enjoyed good price gains, the largest rises
	were seen for wool between 18 and 22 microns. Crossbred
	wool prices recorded moderate increases. As a result, the
	EMI lifted back above the 1500 c/kg level, to 1506 c/kg, a
	rise of 28 UScents. The AUD rose by 0.7 UScents for the
	week and the EMI was 31 UScents higher at 1146 USc/kg. It
	was another small weekly offering of 28,7585 bales. With
	prices rising, the pass-in rate fell to 6.3%

- Sydney hosted a successful two-day sale, opening on Wednesdsay with solid price rises of 10 to 20 cents for Merino fleece wools. Prices for the very small offering of Crossbred wool were unchanged, as were most Oddment types. Thursday saw buyers compete strongly for the Merino offering, particularly 18 to 22 micron wool with prices rising by 20 to 50 cents. A limited offering of 17.5 micron and finer wool saw more modest price rises. Prices were firm to a little higher for the few lots of Crossbred wool on offer. Locks rose a little while Stains and Crutchings were firm.
- The two-day sale in Melbourne saw significant price rises on both days for Merino wool across the micron range. The largest increases over the week were for wool between 19 and 22 micron, up by 40 to 70 cents. Finer wools gained 20-30 cents. Buyers paid particular attention to fleece lots with VM of 1.5% or less. The Crossbred offering saw prices hold firm on Wednesday and then gain ground on Thursday, notably for 28 and 30 micron lots. Oddments were down a little on Wednesday and then held on Thursday.
- Fremantle hosted a small two-day sale and recorded large price gains compared with the previous sale a fortnight ago. Buyers were initially focused on 20-22 micron wool on Wednesday, pushing prices higher. On Thursday, buyers broadened their attention and prices for all the Merino wools on offer lifted, including the limited volumes of 19 micron and finer wool. Stains and Crutchings were 10 cents dearer this week while Locks and Lambs were up by 15-30
