Wool Market Movements

•	Renewed buyer activity saw the Australian wool market
	record a strong rise this week, reversing the drift lower in
	recent weeks. Prices for Merino wool across the micron
	range enjoyed significant gains, but prices for broader
	Crossbred wool fell back. As a result, the EMI rose by 28
	cents to 1550 c/kg. After falling last week, the AUD
	steadied at 78.3 UScents and the EMI rose by 23 UScents
	to 1214 USc/kg. There were 38,217 bales on offer in the
	three selling centres. With prices lifting, the pass-in rate
	dropped to 3.6%.

- The two-day sale in Sydney saw prices for Merino wool lift strongly on both days in response to renewed demand from buyers. While Best and Spinners style fine wools were in demand, it was the lower spec fine wools and medium and broader Merino wools which enjoyed the largest increases. Disappointingly, buyers were less interested in the Crossbred lots on offer, with prices falling by 10-25 cents. The renewed interest in Oddments continued, with buyers particularly keen on Locks, and prices lifted 20-30 cents.
- Melbourne hosted a two-day sale on Wednesday, and Thursday and prices for almost all Merino wool microns lifted by 20-60 cents. With buyer competition intensifying, even lower spec wools saw solid price rises. The exception was 16.5 micron wool foor which prices eased. Better prepared Crossbred wools were sought and prices lifted but the poorer prepared lots were of less interest and prices fell. Oddments were keenly sought by buyers, with strong price gains for Locks, Crutchings and Stains, although the AWEX Merino Carding indicator did not reflect the strength of demand.
- Fremantle recorded the strongest price gains of the three selling centres when it opened on Wednesday. Prices for fine Merino wool rose by 25-35 cents while the medium Merino lots gained 20-30 cents. The gains were less impressive on Thursday, with prices in general steady to 10 cents higher. A combination of a limited selection and buyer competition saw prices for Oddments rise by 20-35 cents over the week.
