Wool Weekly

Wool Market Movements



•	After the breakneck pace seen in recent weeks, buyers took a breather this week in the Australian wool market.
	Prices for Merino wool finer than 19 micron fell back from
	the record heights of last week, while prices for broader
	Merino wool eased or were a little higher. Prices for
	Crossbred wools were mainly lower. The EMI slid by 16
	cents to 2011 c/kg. The catalyst to the slide seems to have
	been a higher AUD which was just under 1 UScent higher.
	The EMI increased by 6 UScents to 1538 USc/kg. There
	were 26,942 bales offered in Sydney and Melbourne. With prices sliding, the pass-in rate lifted to 3.6%.

	There were 11,516 bales on offer in Sydney at a two day
	sale this week. Demand for Merino fleece and skirting
	wool eased back on Wednesday as buyers held back after
	he recent strong rises. The lower spec and higher VM lots
	were most affected by the declines. A poor selection of
	Crossbred wools saw prices slide a little. In contrast, Locks
	were in demand and prices for Oddments rose. Thursday's
	sale saw prices for fine Merino wool (19 microns and
	iner) fall back, notably the lots with high VM and high
	mid-break. Prices for broader Merino wools rose,
	narrowing the price differentials with fine Merino wools.
	Crossbreds wools were unchanged. The Oddment market
	vas steady.
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• Melbourne hosted a two day sale with 15,426 bales on
offer. Buyers were more hesitant than recently. Prices for
finer Merino wool eased back on Wednesday, mainly for
the lower spec lots, while the medium Merino lots saw
prices maintained at last week's close. Crossbred wools
were a little lower. Fine Locks increased in price but Stains
and Crutchings eased back. Thursday's sale saw demand
weaken for fine Merino wool and prices were down by 20-
30 cents, although the better spec wools were less
affected. 19 to 22 micron wools closed steady. Crossbred
wools eased back by 5-10 cents. Oddments also pulled
back on Thursday as demand softened.
