

Wool Market Movements
The Australian wool market has rebounded from the doldrums of the past weeks with record weekly increases in each of the three Regional Indicators. Buyer confidence returned with demand and bids increasing as the sale progressed. The broader, >18.5 $\mu m$ , Micron Price Guides (MPGs) were keenly sought. The EMI gained 170 cents for the week - the highest weekly gain on record - to close at 1,535 c.kg dean. The national pass-in rate was 6.2%, 5.3% lower than last week. Sales continue next week with 31,107 bales on offer across the three selling centres.

- A single day's sale saw strong demand generate significant price increases in Sydney on Wednesday. Large price rises occurred across all MPGs, both Merino and Crossbred, with the 18.5 μm to 21 μm Merino range gaining between 130 and 185 cents and Crossbreds between 65 to 100 cents. Merino skirtings were also back in favour gaining between 80 to 100 cents. The oddment sector dimbed upwards with locks and stains increasing by up to 100 cents and crutchings by up to 70 cents. The Northern Regional Indicator gained 126 cents to close at 1,534 c/kg clean and the Northern Merino Carding Indicator gained 92 cents to 906 c/kg clean. The Sydney pass-in rate was 8.0%.
- The two-day sale in Melbourne saw prices surge upwards with gains of at least 111 cents across all MPGs. The 18.5 to 22 µm lots gained between 186 and 304 cents for the week. The Southern Regional Indicator gained 132 cents on Wednesday and a further 66 cents on Thursday to close at 1,536 c/kg clean. The Merino Skirtings market was solid, with Best Style lots gaining up to 180 cents for the week. Crossbreds wools gained up to 115 cents and oddments also strengthened. The Southern Merino Carding Indicator jumped 186 cents to 1,007 c/kg clean. The Melbourne pass-in rate was 3.5%
- Price gains in Fremantle followed the trend of the Eastern states, driven in part by a reduced offering as 29% of lots were withdrawn prior to Wednesday's sale. Further price rises occurred on Thursday with strong buyer competition a feature of the day. A small offering of Merino Skirtings was keenly sought, increasing by up to 200 cents on Wednesday and a further 70 cents on Thursday. Oddment lots were also dearer. The Western Regional Indicator gained a record 242 cents for the week to close at 1,625 c/kg dean. The Western Merino Carding Indicator gained 100 cents to 955 c/kg dean. The Fremantle pass-in rate was 5.7%
